Weeks 4-6 Preferably the ST <i>should be</i> <i>teaching</i> the edTPA lessons in weeks 5-6, BUT just in case they get off to a fast start week 4 is okay too. Additionally, it is highly recommended that STs NOT be already full-time teaching in order for them to properly complete the edTPA product.	 Actively Teach the 3-5 Lessons for edTPA Collect and grade student work especially those chosen samples for the edTPA product. Record as many lessons as possible from the edTPA sequence. Begin writing the Task 1 Commentary. 	 Help record the lessons is an essential help area, so that the ST can focus on the teaching of the lessons. Offer support BUT no Direct Feedback on the recorded lessons, as the ST must be the one who truly reflects on these lessons.

Weeks 7-8 These weeks are for the ST to focus on writing Commentaries (3 perhaps 4). Once again it is recommended that candidates NOT yet have all the CE's responsibilities yet. Remember this is the mid-point in the semester so there are several weeks left to teach.	 ST should be completing all commentaries and possibly doing peer reviews. ST should be organizing their Tasks for upload and submission. ST will upload and submit to Pearson the e-portfolio atthe end of Week 8. 	 CE can focus on encouraging ST to be truly reflective on next steps with their commentaries (can't read though). CE can double check on ST organization of files. Try not to add any extra responsibilities for the ST during Week 8 especially so that they can complete the product.
